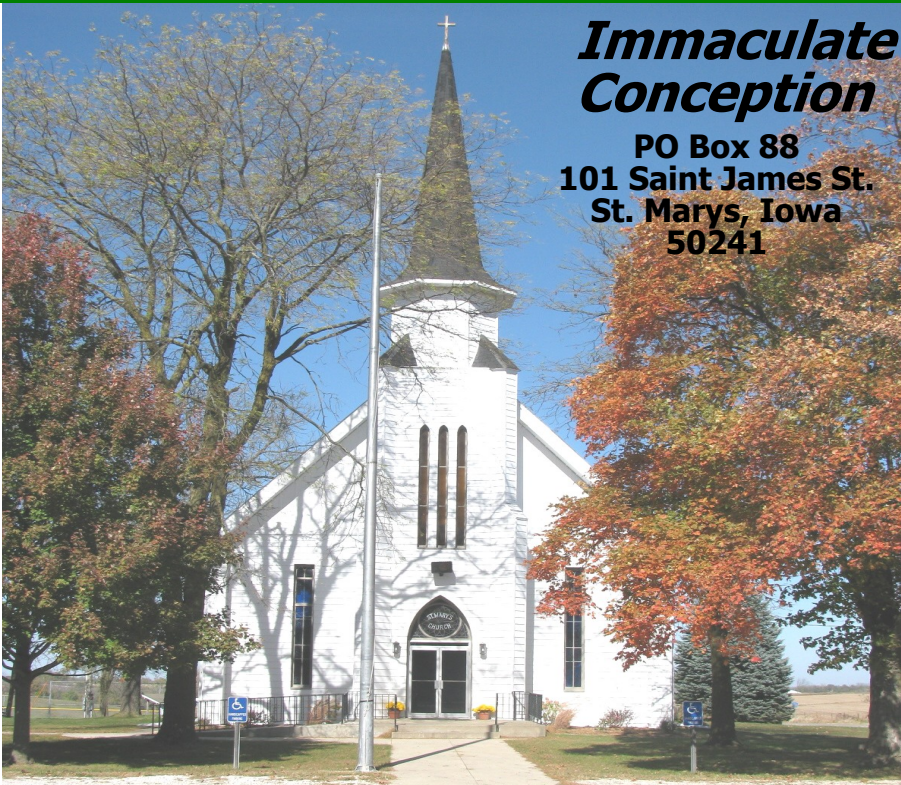

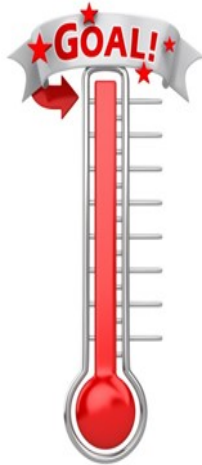

Relics

Relics are part of the body of a saint, or sometimes an object that they owned or touched. These relics remind us of the holiness of the person and their closeness with God. Every altar in a church contains relics. Many miracles worked by God through relics were recorded in the Bible and continue to occur today.

There are three classes of relics:

1 st class – items from Christ's life (like the True Cross) or part of the remains of a Saint (like a bone)

2 nd class – items worn or frequently used by a Saint

3 rd Class – any items touched to a 1 st or 2 nd class relic

Do you know another name for All Saints Day?

Another name for All Saints' Day is All Hallows' Day or Halloween. This is the feast that is celebrated in honor of all the known and unknown saints. This day is usually designated as a national holiday in many countries that are historically Catholic. We celebrate the solemnity of All Saints on November 1 every year in the Catholic Church. What is the difference between All Saints Day and All Souls Day?
